Our April 25 meeting featured a presentation on fluorescent minerals sweetened with a ice cream social so that there was something for your eyes and mind, and something for your taste buds. Jim Herbold's topic was "Fluorescent Dinosaur Bone Fossils".

Permineralization occurs when the spaces filled with gas or liquid during life become filled with mineral-rich water and the minerals precipitate out of the water, occupying the empty spaces. This process can result in very detailed, colorful, and beautiful fossils.

Further detail in his presentation was to focus on specific examples of fluorescent mineralization. Such fossils are highly sought and increasingly valuable. Jim's PowerPoint included pictures of many beautiful examples, Thank you, Jim, for a fascinating and informative presentation.

Our first rock and mineral sale for 2023 was on **Saturday, April 29**. There were lots of rocks and some tools and minerals to choose from, plus fun for all as we looked for treasures.

Will You Be Our Next Breccia Editor?

The Breccia has been published regularly since July 1953. I love being its latest editor, but I have done so for about seven years, and it is time to pass this privilege on to another person. It is a privilege, a challenge, and an opportunity to learn and to develop new skills.

One of our members expressed a concern to me that may be a reason that it has been difficult to find an editor to replace me, and that is that the Breccia has special features such as articles, puzzles, and cartoons. Usually I include two or three articles, sometimes a puzzle, and occasional cartoons or jokes. These extra features take a lot of time, but they are not necessary. The Breccia's most important function is to inform members about current and anticipated activities and to report on those activities just completed. Any thing else is frosting on the cake. A good cake does not need frosting, and a Breccia that keeps the membership informed of club activities does not need articles, puzzles, and cartoons.

I could add all these special features because I am retired with the extra time for this considerable amount of extra effort. What have I done to include the extra features? Articles have come from various sources. I have written some of them. Writing an article takes a lot of my time because I must research first and then from what I have learned, try to write something that is accurate and readable. As far as I can see in reading other rock club publications, I am one of the very few that has written my own articles, and therefore, this is not a necessary requirement.

I found that I liked making puzzles, but they are definitely not necessary. To help in creating crossword and word-search puzzles, I have used an online utility available mainly for teachers. In turn, the utility can include in their library, the puzzles that I have created. It's a good trade-off.

Many people have contributed articles for the Breccia. Our main contributor and excellent author is Professor Philip Kesten from Santa Clara University. I included one of his articles in every 2022 issue of the Breccia and have many more available, because Professor Kesten has very generously offered many more articles for publication in the Breccia!

I receive via email several publications from editors for other rock clubs, and in return, I email the Breccia to them. We use each other's articles making good articles available to a wider range of readers.

If a new editor has the time, there is help as I have just described above, for adding articles, puzzles, and even cartoons and jokes. Several of our members have sent me good jokes and cartoons, and as I snicker happily, I add them to the Breccia. Thank you!

A new editor with limited time may decide to include only club business as I have done in this Breccia. A new editor with some extra time may decide to add extra features. It is up to whoever will be the next Breccia editor. Can you be that person?


